- 9:00am The 5K starts at Porter on the Lake Park on Dietz Road in Youngstown

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- Both races cross the same finish line. To photograph finishers & medal presentations:
 - Winner of the 5K will cross the finish line around 9:15am at Porter on the Lake Park on Dietz Road, Youngstown and receive medal & prizes
 - The winner of the half marathon will finish around 10:15am at Porter on the Lake Park on Dietz Road, Youngstown and receive medal and prizes
- Post-race party concert begins at 11:00am with music by *Strictly Hip*, food trucks, beer, and fun!
